



Health Begins with Her

Amref's Big Give Match-funded Christmas Challenge

In partnership with The Big Give, the UK's biggest online match-funding platform, we're launching the **Health Begins with Her** campaign this winter to train midwives, **so women and their babies are supported, before, during and after birth.**



From midday on **#GivingTuesday** November 29th until 6th December 2022, every donation made to this campaign will be doubled. We are aiming to raise £100,000 and unlock match funding to train even more midwives to support mothers to give birth safely and ensure their new-born babies have the best start in life.



Every two minutes, a woman dies from preventable causes related to pregnancy and childbirth - two thirds of these women live in sub-Saharan Africa. Access to support from a trained midwife can end this.

The Challenge

South Sudan is one of the most dangerous places in the world to give birth, where only one in five births takes place in the presence of a skilled health worker.

This was what 25-year-old Miriam Joseph faced when she experienced complications while pregnant in Maridi, South Sudan. Miriam's baby was in a breech position, making delivery difficult – and dangerous. It left her with the frightening prospect of having a c-section.

Thanks to the trusting relationship she developed with Hellen, her assigned midwife, the complications were quickly identified, and the danger subsided. Hellen supported Miriam to safely deliver her healthy baby boy, Joel.

"More women should have a Hellen," says Miriam.

Yet for many women in Miriam's community there is no Hellen and complications like hers too often result in death. This is preventable. When a woman gives birth with the support of a trained midwife, any complications can be immediately addressed to stop preventable deaths.

Our work to date

Improving maternal health is at the heart of our work. Every year, Amref supports thousands of midwives, doctors and health workers across sub-Saharan Africa who are working for change by supporting mothers and their babies

 In South Sudan, Amref is supporting midwifery students to complete their three-year diploma and become fully qualified.

- In Zambia, we have been working with communities to improve the quality of maternal, newborn and child health by building the capacity of health workers and training midwives on respectful maternity care to improve services.
- Throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, Amref trained **530 nurses and midwives in Uganda** with new, life-saving skills through our online e-Learning programme. We have seen a significant reduction in maternal and infant mortality rates in the health facilities whose staff have been enrolled on the e-Learning programme.
- In Tanzania, our Uzazi Uzima ("Safe Deliveries")
 programme has significantly reduced the number of
 maternal and child deaths in the Simiyu Region by
 improving access to antenatal services. Since the
 start of the project, the number of births that take
 place at a health facility has risen from 24% to 80%.

How will we achieve this?



We will train and support more midwives through face-to-face and online learning

- meaning they have the option to upskill without having to take time off from their vital work. Our training covers technical skills and - just as importantly - patient care. Amref-trained midwives can ensure women have a positive experience of birth and feel respected and listened to throughout the process.



We will include sexual and reproductive health in our maternal health programmes so that women are equipped to make informed choices about family planning and contraception.



We will build the capacity of local health systems to provide quality health services; to improve access to quality antenatal care; to empower and educate the communities on their sexual and reproductive health and rights; and to encourage an uptake of those services.



We will advocate at the highest levels for additional investments in maternal healthcare – including a significant increase in the number of trained midwives and nurses available to support women throughout their pregnancies.

With your support, we can continue to build on this work to improve mothers and babies' access to quality health care.

£2,500 once matched could provide £5,000 to train 20 midwives in Uganda in new-born care online via Amref's e-Learning platform



- £5,000 once matched could provide £10,000 to train 20 midwives in Zambia in respectful maternity care
- £15,000 once matched could provide £30,000 to cover the costs of 4 tutors to teach the midwifery diploma course for one year in South Sudan
- £25,000 once matched could provide £50,000 to train 10 midwives in South Sudan supporting them to become fully qualified through the three-year midwifery diploma course
